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## **Introduction**

This guide provides information on the continuum of substance abuse treatment services for women and families in Massachusetts. The Massachusetts Department of Public Health/ Bureau of Substance Abuse Services has a long history of supporting specialized services for women and families. Through collaborations with other agencies and communities, services now exist for women affected by substance abuse, domestic violence, and/or HIV.

Many treatment types serve both women and men in every program. These include: Acute Treatment Services (inpatient detoxification), Transitional Support Services, Outpatient Counseling, Acupuncture Services, Compulsive Gambling Services, and Opioid Treatment, and these services are therefore not listed separately in this guide. ## **DETOXIFICATION PROGRAMS WITH SPECIALIZED COMPONENTS FOR PREGNANT WOMEN**

Pregnant women may be accepted at any licensed detoxification program in the state. However, the programs listed below have specialized components for pregnant women. These programs offer linkages to prenatal care, obstetrical services, aftercare treatment and planning, and other appropriate and necessary services. The programs accept women in all trimesters of pregnancy, and utilize specific medical protocols for the safe detoxification of pregnant women. Each program has beds for pregnant women addicted to alcohol and other drugs.

## **OUTPATIENT AND DAY TREATMENT SERVICES FOR PREGNANT AND POSTPARTUM WOMEN**

All outpatient and opioid treatment programs licensed by the Department of Public Health/Bureau of Substance Abuse Services provide services to women, including pregnant and postpartum women. Most outpatient programs offer women's groups.

The programs listed below have specialized components for pregnant women up to 60 days postpartum. These programs provide intensive outpatient and day treatment services, including case management. The programs include individual and family counseling, and offer linkage to prenatal and pediatric medical care, obstetric services, early intervention and child care, and other appropriate and necessary services as needed.

The community-based women's residential substance abuse treatment programs listed below have specialized services for pregnant women, and postpartum women *with their babies*. These programs offer linkage to prenatal and pediatric care, obstetrical services, early intervention programs, aftercare treatment and planning, and other appropriate and necessary services. Women in all trimesters of pregnancy can enter these programs, deliver their babies, and return from delivering their babies to continue their residential treatment with their infants. Postpartum women with infants up to two months of age can also enter.

## **RESIDENTIAL SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT PROGRAMS FOR FAMILIES**

Massachusetts offers long-term residential substance abuse treatment for parent(s) recovering from addiction to alcohol and other drugs (AOD), who have custody of their children, are homeless and eligible for Emergency Assistance, and/or have a DSS-verified re-unification plan with their children within 30 days of admission. Bilingual, bicultural services for Latino families are available. One program serves single fathers and two-parent families with their children.

The programs promote family preservation and offer a structured and comprehensive rehabilitative environment supporting family recovery and encouraging movement towards an independent life in the community. Programs provide a safe and developmentally appropriate environment for parents in treatment, while they maintain custody and care of their children.

The residential programs listed below are collaborations of substance abuse treatment and domestic violence shelter providers with the Massachusetts Department of Social Services to provide a safe home away from current domestic violence for women with substance abuse problems and their children. The programs provide substance abuse education and treatment, mental health counseling, domestic violence education and support, life skills and case management. In addition, the programs link families to legal and housing advocacy within the community. Childcare, education through local public schools, mental health counseling, including intensive child witness to violence programming, substance abuse education, and recreational activities are provided for the children.

## **SOBER LIVING PROGRAMS WITH SUPPORTIVE CASE MANAGEMENT SERVICES FOR HOMELESS FAMILIES**

The Family Sober Living Programs with Supportive Case Management Services serve *homeless* recovering parents and their children (ages birth through 18). Eligibility is based on criteria for Emergency Assistance, including homelessness and history of substance abuse. The purpose of the Sober Living Programs is to provide a transitional, semi-independent, sober living environment for parents, living with their children, who have at least 4-6 months of sobriety, and are enrolled in outpatient substance abuse treatment.

Case management services focus on active search for permanent housing and employment, and recovery support.

All families are referred through a Central Intake Coordinator (CIC) at the Institute for Health and Recovery (617-661-3991 or 866-705-2807 outside of the 617/781 area codes) who will work with programs to place DTA families that have been appropriately screened and assessed. The average length of stay for each family is expected to be from 3-6 months, or until the family has secured housing.
